HEALTH SERVICES

Our Health Services Team provides:

- Primary care for children and adults
- Preventative health care and education
- Prenatal classes, Pregnancy care and Postnatal care
- Immunizations and flu shots for children and adults
- Medical care for frail and homebound seniors

- Medical care for uninsured clients
- Chronic Disease prevention and management
- Mental Health and Addictions support
- Telephone consultations
- On-call 24 hour assistance by staff physicians and residents



PHYSIOTHERAPY

Our Physiotherapy Team provides:

- Assessment and treatment for a wide range of physical injuries and diseases
- Individual and group programs for wellness, mobility and independent function
- Disease, injury and disability prevention

- Education on acute and chronic condition management
- Pain control and selfmanagement techniques



CHIROPODY (FOOT CARE)

Our Chiropody Team provides:

- Assessment and diagnosis of diseases, disorders and dysfunctions of the foot
- Assisted care of non-curable soft tissue aliments
- Routine procedures such removing corns and calluses, and nail care
- Minor surgical and soft tissue procedures


- Fitting and manufacturing custom made devices and braces
- Preventative care and education for overall foot health management
- Priority to children under age 18, seniors, injured clients and high risk diabetic individuals



SOCIAL WORK

Our Social Work Team provides:

- Support with a wide range of concerns including poverty, family and relationship difficulties, mental health and wellbeing, etc.
- Case management and therapy services that are client-centred
- Confidential, one-on-one counselling and support groups for individuals and families
- Information, advocacy and connection to available community services and support programs
- Ongoing community wellness and mental health workshops
- One time sessions and ongoing sessions



SEXUAL HEALTH CLINIC

Our Sexual Health Clinic provides:

- Drop-in, confidential and non-judgmental sexual health information and counselling
- Family planning services such as pregnancy testing, birth control and free condoms
- Testing for sexually transmitted infections (STIs)

- Testing for HIV
- Screening for Cervical Cancer through a Pap test*- by appointment only



HEALTH PROMOTION

Our Health Promotion Team provides:

- Health education workshops on prevention and management of chronic conditions
- Children and Parenting support programs including prenatal classes and breastfeeding programs
- Youth programs such as homework clubs, after-school drop in programs, March break and summer camps, mentorship and skills training programs
- Food Security programs including community gardens, community kitchens and training/skills development
- Senior Health and Men's Health education and social programs aimed at decreasing social isolation and promoting health and wellbeing
- Fitness programs such as Yoga, Zumba, Tai-chi and Aerobic classes

- Mental wellbeing programs on stress management and caregiver support
- Access to resources such as computers with internet connection and printing, and space to be used for homework, job search and computer classes
- Advocacy initiatives and engagement in networks that promote health and wellbeing
- Involvement opportunities for community residents and members through advisory and resident-led groups such as Men's Advisory Committee, Oriole Food Space Council, Seniors' Advisory Committees





REGISTERED DIETITIAN SERVICES

Our Registered Dietitian Team provides:

- Healthy eating support for a variety of nutrition needs including disease prevention and management, heart health, healthy weight and other dietary requirements
- One-on-one individual nutrition counselling
- Group education programs on various nutrition topics



DON MILLS DIABETES EDUCATION PROGRAM [DMDEP]

Our DMDEP Team provides:


- One-on-one counselling for individuals with Type 2 diabetes led by registered nurses and dietitians
- Group information sessions on general diabetes management including role of nutrition, exercise, blood sugar monitoring and medication
- Workshops on topics such as nutrition label reading, safe fasting during Ramadan, physical activity, healthy eating, and foot care
- Ongoing review and support sessions to help individuals with diabetes self-manage and live a health and active life



SOUTH ASIAN DIABETES PREVENTION PROGRAM [SADPP]

Our SADPP Team provides:

- Mobile clinics for Early Detection and Diabetes Prevention in regions of Toronto that South Asians call home
- Screening for those who do not live with diabetes, using a unique tool tailored specifically to the South Asian community
- Language-specific and culturallyrelevant resources and services for recently resettled South Asians, on healthy eating, physical activity and mental health



Toronto Public Health Dental offers FREE dental services at our Fairview Site to eligible children and youth (0-17 years), adults enrolled in selected Toronto Public Health programs, and seniors (over 65).

To be eligible for Dental Services:

- You must live in Toronto
- You do not have dental insurance
- You cannot afford dental services

ABOUT HATP

HATP is an innovative initiative led by Flemingdon Health Centre and Thorncliffe Neighbourhood Office in partnership with other providers and community groups.

This unique community-centred initiative applies a social determinants of health lens to enhance local primary health care; improve access to health, social and community services; and promote health and wellbeing in Thorncliffe Park.

HATP services are FREE for residents of Thorncliffe Park (M4H postal code) and are provided by doctors, nurses, and other health professionals.

OHIP coverage is NOT required.

The HATP Teams provide:

- Medical services including blood pressure management, cancer screening, women's health, and diabetes services
- Social Work services including counselling, access to information and resources, and support with concerns such as stress management and mental wellness
- Nutrition services to adults, families and children supporting a variety of nutrition needs
- Family support services including healthy child development
- One-on-one health education services and group workshops on a wide range of topics on good health and wellbeing

- Health promotion activities addressing the social elements that influence good health such as housing, education, employment, culture, and others
- Chiropody services providing basic foot care to seniors, individuals with visual impairments, high risk diabetic or individuals with diabetes, and others
- Referral and access to community resource services, connecting both clients and service providers

- Access and review your health records through our Privacy Officer
- Understand medical treatment relating to the diagnosis, prognosis and risks of treatment associated with the conditions affecting your health

- Refuse or discontinue a treatment, service or support
- Respect for your personally held values and beliefs
- Expect a high quality of care by health professionals employed by FHC
- Expect to receive service in a safe and secure environment
- Be informed of the any fees*

 a service)

HEALTH RECORDS ACCESS & REVIEW


As a client, you have the right to access and review your personal health records. You may request access to your records verbally or in writing by contacting our Privacy Officer at:



OUR LOCATIONS


CATCHMENT AREA




HEALTH ACCESS THORNCLIFFE PARK


HATP services are for residents of Thorncliffe Park (M4H postal code only).
