

Community Service Worker Canada Summer Jobs Program

About FHC: Flemingdon Health Centre (FHC) is an engaged and involved member of some of Toronto's most dynamic neighbourhoods; Flemingdon Park, Fairview and Thorncliffe Park: FHC is a registered charity and an incorporated not-for-profit Community Health Centre (CHC), with a vision of Strong Healthy Communities. Across our three sites, we provide a range of health-related services based on the social determinants of health with extensive community engagement. We are primarily funded through the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care/Ontario Health (formerly: Toronto Central Local Health Integration Network TC-LHIN).

At FHC, we know that health is about much more than just the absence of disease. Our approach to community health encompasses the social determinants of health which includes: education, employment, isolation, food security and social supports, and utilizes a community development model to promote health, prevent disease, and strengthen community capacity. We value health equity, inclusion, community engagement, accountability & transparency, excellence and collaboration & partnerships.

We are currently seeking candidates for the Community Service Worker - to join the Allied Health Team. This role involves working with our Chronic Disease and Mental Health multidisciplinary team to support various community chronic disease-related programs and services. Our program supports the community development model to promote health, prevent disease, and strengthen community capacity. You will work closely with the Chronic Disease and Mental Health Service Worker to connect and engage community partners and various health professionals for promoting our wide range of programs and services. As determined by government direction and in alignment with all safety protocols, including the provision of appropriate PPE, activities will be virtual or in person. This position is funded through the Canada Summer Jobs Program.

Responsibilities include:

- Assist in promoting diabetes education and other chronic disease-related programs - in person or virtually, to encourage referrals, recruit program participants and create general community awareness about FHC and the services we provide.
- Support collaboration with partners including various internal and external healthcare providers to coordinate outreach and program activities.
- Support the delivery of educational group sessions and workshops on/offsite.
- Conduct research and gather information for content design improvement and suggest interactive activities for in-person and virtual Chronic Disease and Mental Health Workshops.
- Participate in workshop planning and evaluation activities.

Qualifications, Skills and Proficiencies:

- At least one year of work, volunteer or academic experience in related healthcare field or in a discipline applicable to the position.
- Flexible and enthusiastic team player.
- A commitment to social change and equity

- Ability to work within a diverse community (people of different ages, abilities and cultural backgrounds)
- Attention to detail and excellent organizational skills is a must
- Strong time management skills and ability to work independently
- Some proficiency in Microsoft Office, in particular with Microsoft Excel
- Vaccines (COVID-19 and others) are a requirement of the job pursuant to the Ontario Human Rights Code
